

Lutheran Men In Mission, Voting Delegate Job Description

LMM's Vision: For every man to have a growing relationship with Jesus Christ through an effective Men's Ministry in every congregation.

How do you become a Lutheran Men In Mission (LMM) Voting Delegate? Each of the sixty-five synods of the ELCA is allowed up to six voting delegates. They can be elected by their Synod LMM group, appointed by the LMM contact person, and/or appointed by their respective Synod Bishop from their synod.

A. LMM Voting Delegates commitments:

1. The voting delegate will prayerfully commit to seek God's Guidance in full-filling his duties.
2. The voting delegate will commit to support LMM financially and encourage others to the same.
3. The voting delegate will commit to leadership training events provided by LMM.

B. The Voting Delegates responsibilities will be:

1. To attend the Triennial Assembly that they are elected/chosen to attend for their synod.
2. To be available to vote for the Executive Committee which consist of a president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer.
3. To review and vote on all matters forwarded for approval by the LMM Board. This may include such items as the budget, by-laws three year budget, strategic plan, etc.
4. Review and vote on any other business brought forth by the LMM Executive Director, LMM Board or Synod Voting Delegates.
5. The voting delegates will meet in caucus with their respective synods by region to elect a Regional Director for each of the nine regions in the ELCA.

C. The Voting Delegate will commit to a three year term ending when the next voting delegate takes office.

1. Each voting delegate will have the responsibility to vote at any Special Called meeting or conference call of LMM to take action on business items requiring review and approval by the Assembly Delegates. This may include items that require changes to the By-laws, Articles of Incorporation changes or other business deemed necessary by the Executive Committee and LMM Board between regular scheduled Triennial Assemblies.

D. The time spent performing this job while not attending the fore mentioned meetings will be reading to be knowledgeable of LMM activities and only time if addition meetings are called. These meetings will be handled through e-mails and/or conference calls.
