

The Parable of the Mustard Seed

³¹ He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. ³² Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches." Matthew 13:31-32

This scripture was the focus one Sunday morning this summer. As my pastor shared about a tree being a symbol for the kingdom of God, I got to thinking about Lutheran Men in Mission's logo for the Presidents Legacy Circle.

As a tree's roots go deeper, the tree grows in strength and space. The branches provide so many ways for the tree to be useful—perhaps as a resting spot or a home for birds, squirrels, and other animals.
